

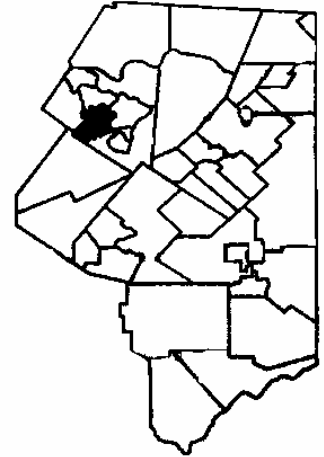
## Glenburn Township, Lackawanna County
